










Breastfeeding Friendly Child Care Guide

The free EPIC BEST (Breastfeeding Education, Support, and Training) program is a one-hour statewide CME/CEU practice education program using office-based change as the key to promoting initiation and increasing duration of exclusive breastfeeding. EPIC BEST aims to improve policies that support breastfeeding, recognize misconceptions that create barriers and provide guidance to support parents in feeding and more. This training can be offered in person or virtually.

PUMP Act Q&A and Discussion


With the recent legislation on the PUMP Act in 2022, there are a lot of questions from both employees and employers.

Protect Sick Babies Bill Update

SB500 came out of committee on May 2, 2023. Mandated Medicaid coverage for donor milk for inpatient and outpatients with certain conditions. Now is the time to educate your legislators on the value of donor milk to babies. Learn more.

Update to Clinical Guidelines for Infant Feeding by the National Institute of Health (NIH), Clarifying Breastfeeding Guidance for People with HIV
